Samuelson's Economics have been studied with a view to investigating how the features and extent of the readers' engagement have evolved and changed. The analysis shows how in the different editions of the textbook, especially the more recent ones, the author's tend's to use a more technical language and a more assertive and precise tone in order to cater to the needs of the ever-increasingly globalized readership.
